

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Spring is in full swing and with it comes many significant events at Pinewood. The staff and students have been working diligently to learn all the songs, choreography, and acting cues for our Al Pichler production of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat". With two matinees and evening shows (Wednesday, May 1 and Thursday, May 2), we hope that everyone can come out and enjoy the show. Thanks to all the parent volunteers who have helped make the show come together. We are looking forward to our community gathering on Friday, May 3 for Family Fun Night and the students are training hard for the track meet on Wednesday, May 8. Another significant event for the staff is to start planning for the setup of classes for next school year. At Pinewood Elementary and all other schools, there are always changes to our student population and school staff resulting from many factors. To help us make the best decisions possible around configuring the school for next year, it is extremely important that our student numbers be accurate and, therefore, I would ask for families who will be moving out of our area to contact the school as soon as possible with this information. Similarly, if you know of a family moving into our area, please encourage them to register their children as soon as possible, but no later than <u>September 2</u> to increase the likelihood of securing a spot at Pinewood Elementary.

As we plan for the 2019-20 school year I would like to make families aware of some of the many factors that are important in organizing classes for next year.



# STAFFING AND CLASS SIZE:



The number of staff members assigned to Pinewood is decided by the Delta School District and is based on projected student enrolment. Enrolment estimates and class size guidelines affect the configuration of classes. Class composition language also determines how classes can be set up to meet contractual obligations. Combined (split) classes are an organizational necessity based on our student numbers. Teachers' instruction and assessment cycles are guided by the

curriculum and the needs of the students in their classes. Research indicates that multi-age groupings provide very positive learning environments for children. Studies show that children in multi-age classes learn to become more independent, responsible learners and develop a greater degree of social responsibility. The diversity of abilities and interests of students in straight classes can be equally as great as the range in combined classes; not all kids of the same chronological age are at the same stage of development or of their learning.

# **CRITERIA FOR STUDENT PLACEMENT:**

Assigning students to particular classes is a very complex task that teachers spend many hours working collaboratively on. When staff builds classes for the next year they take into consideration a variety of factors. These include but are not limited to: learning styles and strengths, what a student is able to achieve in relation to the goals of the curriculum, degree of independence in work habits, social and personal needs, age and physical maturity, previous placements, gender, behaviour, distribution of support resources, and personality fit. The professional staff, including teachers, support staff, and administrator are in contact with the children in the school setting for 30 hours a week and know best where a student will be the most successful. Therefore, the classroom placement of students must be determined through school-based professional evaluations. Our objective is to create balanced classes where students can reach their full potential. I fully trust that our Pinewood teachers have an excellent understanding of the academic, behavioural, and social needs of the children in our school and therefore can best determine where individual children should be placed.

# PARENT INPUT:

As our partners, we recognize that parents have important information that may assist with the placement of students. Parents are welcome to provide insight to the school about personal, medical, or social needs that could affect a child's learning environment. Our staff will keep this information in mind where possible, along with the above considerations when building classes. This information cannot include a request for placement with, or not with, a particular teacher. Any requests received that request a specific teacher will not be considered. To offer this input, a downloadable form is available on the Pinewood website under OUR SCHOOL >REGISTRATION. When completed, the form must be emailed to the principal at jhope@deltasd.bc.ca by May 31, 2019. Input received after this date cannot be accommodated.

Many factors, such as maternity leaves, retirements, and lay-offs combine to make school staffing a changing and on-going process. Also, staff members may change grade levels due to school needs or to further professional growth. This may mean that your child could be placed with the same teacher for a second year or that your child could be in a combined class for two consecutive years. Whatever the scenario, we strive to place your child in a warm, caring environment that will maximize their learning.

#### **Dress Code**



The school's Dress Code supports the general Code of Conduct but is more specific. When students come to school, they spend their day engaged in learning activities and should consider school as their place of work. Students should come to school appropriately dressed for their day.

Students may not come to school wearing clothing with obscene, suggestive, or insulting words, pictures, or slogans on them. Hats are not to be worn inside the building, and students are asked to dress so that no underwear is visible. Strapless, low-

cut, spaghetti straps, midriff-baring, or otherwise revealing outfits are not appropriate for school. Also, some clothing is more appropriate for recreational activities outside of school. For example, in warmer weather, students are often tempted to wear clothing that is better suited for the beach or pool deck. Students should come to school wearing safe, play-appropriate footwear (this is especially important on days they have P.E. class or are participating in athletic activities) but is practical for everyday use because students play outside at recess and lunch times. Students who come to school wearing clothing that detracts from the learning environment will be asked to change or, if necessary, will be given clothing supplied by the school.

#### **Building Security**



Thank you for observing the expectations for visitors to enter the school during the school hours only via the front door and only after checking in at the office. All visitors should be wearing a red VISITOR badge available at the school office. It is imperative to school security that we know who is in the hallway during regular school hours.

#### **Party Invitations**

The school often forms the hub of children's social interactions. Birthday parties are something many kids look forward to as an opportunity to have school friends join them in celebrating. We recognize it is not practical nor realistic for every child to be invited to every function, but the disappointment that comes with that can have a negative impact on student learning when our younger students in particular see others getting invitations at school when they themselves may not. To limit negative repercussions, we ask that birthday invitations not be distributed in the school by students or parents. We ask that every effort be made to contact families at their homes, or in situations where that is not possible, please make contact on the playground <u>after</u>



school is dismissed for the day. We ask that parents help kids to understand that not everyone is invited to everything and it doesn't mean that children can't be friends. Understanding the importance of empathizing with kids who may be left out of some functions is also important for social development, as it will happen to everyone at some point as they move through school.
