Dear Parents and Guardians:

Students will have a fun time walking through each other's classrooms then through the Gym to show off their costumes and showing appreciation for others. Parents are welcome to join us in the Gym and may snap a few photos of their own children as they walk by. This is a continued change from previous years where parents lined the hallways. We ask that parents not pause the parade to take photos with their children please.

Remembrance Day Assembly

On Friday, November 8 at 10:45 am we will be holding our annual Remembrance Day Assembly (parents and other family members are welcome - doors open at 10:30 – please enter and exit via the gym doors off the playground). As this is a solemn occasion, there should be no applause, photography, or unnecessary noise during the ceremony. Over the years, I have always been very proud of how students have shown respect and honor to the many Canadians, past and present, who serve our country. We will be collecting donations at the door for the Poppy Fund.



Thank you to all the teachers and their students who are performing or providing artwork and an extra thank you to our Music teacher, Mrs. Kato, for working with many of the performers. Each student will receive a poppy to wear at this assembly and we will be collecting donations for the Poppy Fund starting November 5.

Field Trips

Students have had some amazing field trips already this year, largely funded by the fundraising efforts of our Parent Advisory Council (PAC). These funds are used for students to access venues that further enhance the learning of the classroom. We thank parents who help out by providing transportation for classes; those who can transport more than their own child will have their admission covered should they wish to partake in the trip. Please remember to provide a



booster seat to your child should they require one in a car. Please note that drivers assisting with field trips are required to go from the school to the venue and back again without making any unscheduled stops. It is instructional time, and if there is another person's child in the car there would be no consent in place for that child to be at an alternate location. Teachers put a lot of effort into planning the time, location, associated learning, and assigning students to a vehicle for transport. We understand people are trying to be helpful by making pre-arrangements, but it is best left to the teachers to plan.

Arrival at School

It is important for students to arrive on time to school. For the safety of students, supervision is provided beginning at 8:40 am. Please do not send students to the school before this time unless there is a school event they are arriving for. On occasion a student may be late. If that is the case, the students will sign in at the office and take a late slip to their classroom. Please do not escort your children to the classrooms as it causes additional disruption to the teaching.



In the case of a high number of lates to school, the principal will contact the family to work on a support plan to ensure children arrive on time and ready to learn.

Thank you to everyone who logged onto Parent Connect to update your contact information and approve your annual permissions (if these are not complete your child will not be able to go on walking field trips, have their photos taken at school, etc.)! Please take some time to ensure all of these are done by following the steps below. Parents can now use the email address the school has on file for you to log in. Please log onto Parent Connect using your email address and password (if you have forgotten your password click on Forgot My Password and your password will be emailed to you). You will need to do this for each of your children attending Pinewood Elementary School.

Under the **Basic** tab you should update Demographic Information (phone numbers, email addresses and emergency contacts). Click on the **Edit** button to the left of the line you need to update and make updates on the right side of the screen.

To add <u>Emergency Release</u> information click on the blue button <u>Emergency/Out of Prov/Other Contacts</u>. Click on the <u>Edit</u> button on the left side of the screen and add contact info on the right side of the screen. Add no more than 3 names (grandparents, etc. residing at the same address can be put on the same line) using type <u>ER - Emergency Release</u> and add 1 name using type <u>OP - Out Of Province Contact</u>. Don't forget to hit <u>SAVE</u> after you make each change/addition.

IMPORTANT: Please note that an <u>ER - Emergency Release</u> is <u>different</u> than an Emergency Contact. <u>In the event of a catastrophic emergency</u>, we are only permitted to release students to people who are listed in <u>the ER - Emergency Release section of Parent Connect.</u> You may want to have the same people under your <u>Emergency Contacts</u> as you have in your <u>ER - Emergency Release</u>, it's up to you.

Dressing for the Weather



Although we enjoyed some wonderful fall weather and many warm sunny days, cooler days are now upon us. As the temperature continues to dip, it is important that the students come dressed in outerwear appropriate for the cold, wet, and wind. Here on the West Coast, rain is just a fact of life. On most days, students will be going outside at recess and lunchtime. It is only in the case of **extremely poor** weather, that we designate the recess and/or lunch hour as an "in day" which means that students are to stay inside and play quietly in their classrooms rather than venture outdoors. We

refrain from doing this unless absolutely necessary, as the children need the opportunity to get out in the fresh air and be physically active before heading back into the classroom.

Not only do students need to be dressed warmly to enjoy themselves outside but it's essential in the event of an emergency or unexpected situation requiring a building evacuation. Many students are still coming to school without jackets and wearing shorts and hoodies ... even on the coldest, rainiest of days. Please ensure your children come to school dressed accordingly to be outside at recess and lunchtime (e.g. boots, coat, and umbrella). Because our field also gets quite mucky and wet at this time of year packing an extra set of clothes into your child's backr

quite mucky and wet at this time of year, packing an extra set of clothes into your child's backpack, no matter what grade they are in, is also suggested.

Fragrance-Free Environment



We remind you that Pinewood Elementary is a fragrance-free zone. We have a number of people here who have severe reactions to fragrances. Please, for the safety of our school community, refrain from wearing scents when visiting the school or from sending your children to school wearing products that are heavily scented. Thank you so much for your cooperation!

Snow Days



If it snows, will there be school? The short answer is ... YES! During extreme winter weather conditions, including heavy snowfalls, all schools in the Delta School District will remain OPEN if at all possible. It is very rare that schools would be closed due to weather conditions or other circumstances. Schools may have a delayed opening to allow schools and

routes to schools to be made safer for the arrival of students.

Any closure/delayed opening will be decided by 7:00 am and will be announced on the district website at www.deltasd.bc.ca To keep phone lines clear, please refrain from phoning to check that we are open.

During extreme weather conditions it is also common for police and other authorities to advise citizens to avoid unnecessary travel. Parents should take this advice as well. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their children's safe travel to and from school. If, for any reason, you feel that a child cannot travel safely to school,

then you should make other arrangements. Schools will be kept open except under extreme circumstances to provide the option of attendance for all, but the decision is the responsibility of each family. Should you choose to keep your child home, please call the office and leave a message reporting your child's absence.

Last winter was very unusual in the amount of snowfall we received and the length of time it remained on the ground. Be advised, should we experience similar weather, the school district is responsible for clearing basic safe access to the building which does not include paved play areas, playgrounds, fields, or informal pathways.

Do You Bring Your Pet to School?



We know that many families enjoy walking their dog when they accompany their children to and from school. We ask that all pets be kept a far distance away from students. If you walk your dog to the school, please arrange to meet your child either off the grounds at the front of the school or at the far edges of the field away from students. Please also try and be aware of children who seem nervous or fearful around animals and respond accordingly. Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation. Also just a reminder to please clean up after your dog.
